Dear Homeowners,

In this December edition you will see more details of events in the lounge over the Christmas period. There's quite a lot and you are invited to them all, so please come to as many as suits you. For some of the events you need to sign up in advance on the notice board in the buggy store. It's also not too late to come to the Christmas Lunch at the White Lodge in Filey on December 10th and for all those attending this event, please pay the £20 to me by Friday 3rd December.

A little tip for those that like Christmas Wreaths on the Front Door. The easiest way to attach one is by loosening one of the small screws that hold the numbers to the front door and then retightening with the ribbon wrapped around it. This avoids damage to the door by screwing in a hook.

I often get enquiries about the Guest Suite at Brigg Court, how to book and pay. The Guest Suite is a bookable ensuite room with twin beds on the ground floor. It has a TV and Tea / Coffee making facilities and costs £25 per night. All the income is added to the Brigg Court account and therefore the more it is used, the lower the service charge! May sound exciting, but the task of cleaning, ironing, and changing the bedding falls to the House Manager. Often people ask why we don't pay a cleaner to do it? It's because at £25 a night we would find ourselves paying people to stay if we used a professional cleaner.

To book the Guest suite you can ring on 01723 516062, or pop in and see me. There is also a Guest Suite Diary in the cupboard drawer in the communal lounge, where homeowners can check availability and pencil in a booking, but it important these are brought to my attention and confirmed.

Payment for the Guest Suite by Chantry Gardeners Homeowners is by credit card ringing the McCarthy Stone payment line on 01202 362444. Brigg Court Homeowners can pay the same way, or they may choose to pay by direct debit if they have a completed direct debit mandate. Finally, you are also entitled to book a Guest Suite in any of the McCarthy Stone 400+ run sites around the country. There is a complete list of our developments with contact emails in the communal lounge.

I will not be on site on the Christmas Bank Holidays, namely Mon 27th Dec, Tues 28th Dec and Mon 3rd Jan. I am also on annual leave 6th – 14th January, but Christine Parkinson will be covering for me onsite Fri 7th Jan, Tues 11th and Thurs 13th Jan.

Wildlife













Sightings in October/November mainly by Guy and Jane

4 Roe deer, Redshank, Rock Pipet, Hedgehog, Hare, Fox, Great Crested Grebe (fishing in the sea), Pheasant by Keith at No. 12, 11 Goldfinches, Purple Sandpipers, 3 Turnstones, Knot, Woodcock, several Pheasants near wildlife area, Curlew. Guy is our resident bird watcher and sightings are verified by a RSPB officer. Guy did have to pretend the dog wasn't with him when Loulou got into the wildlife area and had the pheasants fluttering loudly as they always do in all directions. Snow Buntings been seen this week.

43 Oystercatchers spotted by Guy and Jane. Can you beat that? Common on, out on a walk, nothing else to do? Tawny owls heard regularly on site but not yet seen. We don't know whether there is a good supply of rodents or whether they are just calling for a mate.



Halloween 31 October late at night Peter at Number 8 bungalow witnessed a spooky swirling apparition outside the lounge window, was it the Chantry Gardens ghost out on the town for Halloween instead of walking the corridors of Brigg Court? Flood Defences



We have all been keeping an eye on the flood defences above our site. Large pools do accumulate but this means that the work done is holding back the water and will soon attract a number of wild fowl for winter provided they can drag themselves away from Filey Dams. Filey Dams facebook page records lots of birds visiting with good photographs. The white Egret is a favourite and a Spoonbill dropped in during summer.
