Pet Policy

Something you will probably be aware of is that McCarthy Stone Developments have a Pet Policy. If you are thinking of getting a Pet please ask the house manager for a copy. To have a pet you need permission from the Managing Agent, agreeing that the Pet will not be a nuisance to others.

The Policy says that Cats are not allowed to roam free, must live within the Homeowners dwelling and that Cat litter needs to be carefully disposed of. Except for Guide Dogs, smaller breeds of Dogs are recommended for communal living, not least to ensure the homeowner is able to physically handle the dog safely.

The Policy goes on to say that pets are not allowed in the Communal Lounge or Guest suite and need to be kept on a lead in all other areas. The exercise of Dogs needs to be off the site of the development, and it is important that they do not foul the grounds, footpaths or roadways. This Policy applies to visitors as well as Homeowners.

Aime Pendant (Sorry to remind you again but it could save your life)

This is an emergency button (that all Homeowners are issued with on moving in) that can be worn either on



the wrist or on a lanyard around the neck. They are particularly useful for those living alone who are concerned with what might happen If they fall, but they can be used for any health emergency.

When the Aime Pendant is pressed the red light on it shines, showing the pendant is activated. The speech Module in the Hallway will then 'beep', and a Tunstall Operator will answer within a few seconds, asking if help is required. The clever part is that the Tunstall Operator knows that it is the personal trigger (as they call it) that has been pressed so they know that it is a health emergency they are responding to. So, if they cannot speak to anyone, they will call an Ambulance just to be sure. The microphone is good enough to

be heard from most rooms in your property and so by calling out "I have fallen and need help" the Operator has enough information to know the nature of the assistance you need. Don't worry if you activate the Amie pendant by mistake, you can explain to the Tunstall Operator that you are fine when they answer the call, and they will close the call down. The house manager will test the Aime pendants quarterly and Bungalow owners should test theirs. Just tell Tunstall that it is a quarterly test. Most of us did the test beginning of January so they are due to be tested again beginning of April.



Defibrillator The defibrillator is in the kitchen area in Brigg Court. When you are next in there just familiarise yourself with the instructions.

WINDOW CLEANING The bi-monthly clean is due early April Peter will put a notice on the board when he has got a date.

GAS CENTRAL HEATING - BUNGALOW OWNERS ONLY

Just a reminder to bungalow owners Page 5 of your big black book from McCarthy Stone says that your boiler is covered under the manufacturer's warranty but you should get is serviced once a year by a Gas Safe registered engineer to make sure it keeps running smoothly and safely. Some of us have used Jamie Daniel (see the useful information section below), some have used Bodens in Filey 01723 512700 (next to the Salvation Army) or Ideal 01482 498660.

If your hot water supply fails please see Page 6 of your big Black book, carry out all the checks listed in the book, if, after checking everything mentioned, you are unable to find out why there is no hot water:

In the first two years, contact the Customer Services Team. After this time, call a qualified plumber.

The IDEAL boiler is guaranteed for two years

EON TIP – If you are not on a fixed Tariff with your energy supplier do a meter reading and submit it by 31 March 2022 The EON tariff increases by about 55% on 1 April.

FILEY'S NEW NATIONAL COASTWATCH STATION NEEDS YOU!

<u>National Coastwatch Institution</u> (NCI), is dedicated to the safety, protection and preservation of life at sea, is poised to open a new station in Filey, but they need volunteers to run it!

NCI watchkeepers provide the eyes and ears along the coast, monitoring radio channels and providing a listening watch in poor visibility. They are trained to deal with emergencies offering a variety of skills and experience, and full training by the NCI ensures that high standards are met. Subject to planning permission, the Filey Station will be situated at the south end of the Royal Parade.

The first NCI Lookout was opened in 1994 when two fishermen lost their lives off the Cornish coast near a Coastguard lookout which had recently closed. The most northerly NCI station on the east coast is at Hornsea, occupying a former Coastguard Lookout, it opened in 2018. It is one of fifty-six watch stations manned by some 2,565 volunteers.


All the money raised will benefit groups and organisations throughout the borough who rely on charitable donations to continue their excellent work in their communities.
