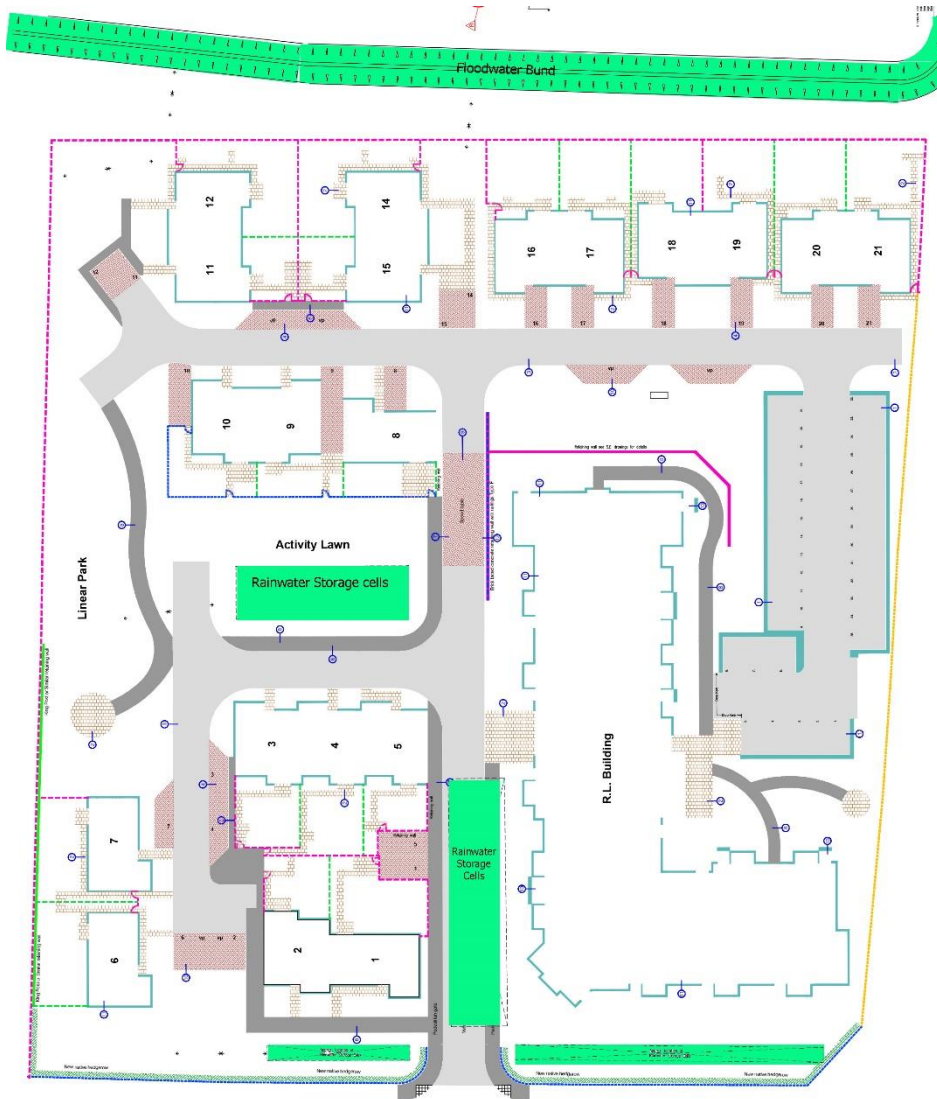

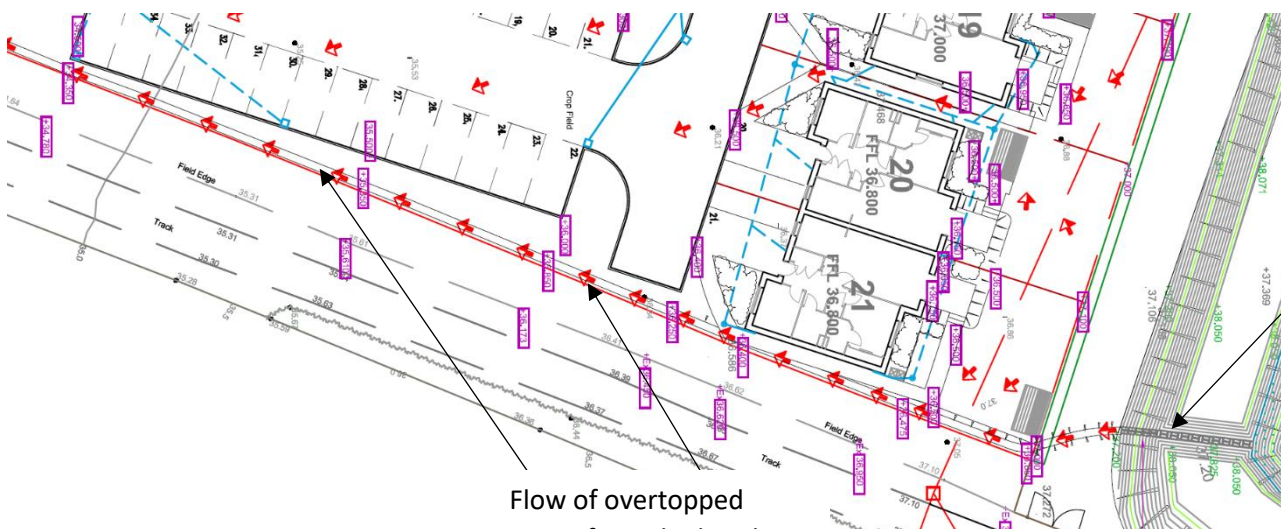
Chantry Gardens Flood defences

The Bund on the north side of the development is to prevent any rainwater runoff from the north fields entering the land to the south. The Bund has enough capacity to accommodate the runoff from a 1-in-1000year storm event. The normal flow will runoff into the public sewer network in a controlled manner.



Any remaining overland surface water runoff generated on the site will be intercepted and picked up by the new drainage system, which contains four underground attenuation tanks, One under the Activity lawn, one under the ground to the south entrance and two along the south boundary.

A channel (swale) formed at the crest of the bund so any overtopping will be directed to the two below ground storage cells along the southern boundary in a shallow swale along the east side of the development this is above the 1-in-1000 year designed for storms exceed the design capacity.

Maintenance Schedule for Northern Earth Bund

In order to ensure optimum operation of the bund periodic inspection and maintenance will be required. The maintenance schedule should be adopted and integrated within the general site management plan. All McCarthy Stone projects retain such maintenance obligation to the purchases of the residential units through annual maintenance charges on each property.

The earth bund will be top soiled to a depth of 250mm and grass seeded using a germinal A3 seed mix (mix proportions as follows).

Strong creeping red fescue 30%, Zurich perennial ryegrass 30%, Essential tall fescue 25%
Aber fleece sheep's fescue 10%, Highland brown top bent grass 5%, The sowing rate shall be 50g/m²

The cutting height will be 25mm with a minimum 2 cuts per year.

The bund will be created in a fenced off area with access gates to a 5m wide access strip either side of the bund. This will provide level access around the bund to allow any necessary maintenance operations to be carried out. The bund should require very little ongoing maintenance. The following is a schedule outlining the necessary operation and frequency:

Item Operation Frequency

Item 1 Litter management. Collect any litter in the area and remove from site. Monthly

Item 1.1 Grass Cutting. Mow grass to 25mm high, Maximum length 75mm. As required. Minimum 2 cuts a year.

Item 1.2 Build-up of silt. Check for any build-up of silt in the area where the water is stored, remove if required. Every six months or after periods of heavy prolonged rainfall.

Item 1.3 Check integrity of bund for any movement or erosion. Annually

Filey Dams

Worth a visit, there is a small car park. 3 bird hides and lots of birds to watch.
