"Dear Resident

As a courtesy, the organisers of this year's "Trackrod Rally Yorkshire" special stages motor car rally would like to advise you of additional vehicular traffic travelling back and forth along Church Cliff Drive on Friday 23 September and Saturday 24 September between the roundabout on Scarborough Road and Filey Brigg Country Park.

26 August at Filey Dams Snipe 2, Common Sandpiper 3, Black Tailed Godwit 1. In the last fortnight in the bay: Scoter, Sanderling, Oystercatchers are back in numbers (Guy Spotted 90+ a few months ago), Gannets fishing in the bay are spectacular. A Curlew is a regular visitor to the Brigg. 23 August a flight of 5 Wimbrel crossing the end of the Brigg. Guy's contact reports a Peregrine Falcon nearby on the Cleveland Way. Eider Ducks, Purple Sandpipers and Turnstones are also present. So lots going on. Please let Guy know what you spot to include in his monthly report.
