If you would like to attend, please sign up on the poster in the buggy room by **Monday 28^{th} February**. The cost is £2 and you get scotch pancakes with all the trimmings and tea / coffee.

Chantry Gardens Window Cleaners

On occasions it has been mentioned to me that the window cleaners are quite expensive and that some Homeowners would rather do the windows in their bungalows themselves. The current contract means that the outside windows are cleaned every other month at a cost per bungalow of £6 plus VAT. This is reasonable and works out at £860 for the whole of Chantry gardens for the year. This is below the budget of £1483 and the difference is returned to homeowners once the accounts are finalised at the end of the financial year. Looking forward, any change would have to be discussed in a meeting and then agreed by a ballot. It is not a straight majority ballot - McCarthy Stone following the voting rules as set down by the Landlord Association. They are quite clever and are designed to maintain the status quo, but allow change where the majority clearly want it. A majority of 66% is required to pass the motion, over 50% of homeowners need to vote and less than 25% against. All these requirements need to be met. This method ensures any change carries the weight of support needed to avoid dispute (and would have made Brexit difficult!). This means that if 5 or more households wanted to keep the current window cleaning arrangement (25%) then it would remain.

QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE 2nd - 5th JUNE 2022

At the informal gathering on 8 February 2022 to discuss plans for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee the following things were noted:

A special long weekend including an extra bank holiday will be held between 2nd and 5th June 2022. There are 54 Commonwealth countries, 7 founding ones. Events will be held nationally, some televised, which can be viewed individually or together on the large lounge TV screen including Trooping the colour, service of thanksgivings and other live broadcasts. It would be nice to decorate the lounge in advance.

Tentative plans for our new community were discussed and a 'Street party' with buffet food and drink for all homeowners who wish to attend, was agreed for **5th June**, **2 pm onwards** on the patio/car park area. it is estimated this will be for around 80 residents. Items available to facilitate this are - large gazebo, 2 or 3 smaller gazebo's, parasols, 6 large paste tables, wooden benches, outdoor chairs (any shortfalls in seating will result in 'bring your own chairs").

A voluntary kitty of £5 a head was agreed as working capital which Daniel will hold. This will help to fund communal requirements such as jubilee tablecloths, bunting, decorations, flags and possibly some of the more expensive food items such as large celebration cake and buffet food (e.g. bulk order of quality sausage meat for sausage rolls, pork pie etc). We hope to purchase some of the jubilee merchandise for our celebration street party in March or early April so please make your **contribution by Tuesday 15 March 2022.**

William may be able to contribute from McCarthy Stone's birthday budget.

If we meet informally once a month to discuss progress this will be 3 more meetings which should result in a well organised celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in our new community.
