Meet our new Operations Manager Kelly Worgan



The senior management of McCarthy Stone has been restructured and the new Operations Manager for our area, Kelly Worgan, joined a well-attended coffee morning at Brigg Court on Thursday October 20th.

She explained that her role was similar to that of the former Area Manager, Tony Hodge, and she was responsible for the 18 developments in the East Coast region.

She said had only been appointed to the job four days before and would need to recruit a replacement for herself as house manager at McCarthy Stone's Cottingham development before throwing herself fully into her new role. She also intends to be on site regularly, at least monthly but probably more often than that.

She gave a brief update on her background. She has been with McCarthy Stone for nearly eight years, as house manager at a number of developments in the local area. She lives in Rawcliffe, between Snaith and Goole.

Kelly began by apologising for things that had happened in the past – a turnover of managers, promises made and not fulfilled – but said she was a very proactive person and wanted to move forward. "I'm looking to a brighter, positive future."

Issues raised at the meeting were:

The budget – particularly charges for the bungalows. Kelly said she would arrange a meeting to discuss budget issues once she has familiarised herself with how our particular budgets work.

Peter will be arranging a day or 2 to take groups of home owners around an apartment and provide a full induction that should have already been done but sadly wasn't for some. All the equipment in the apartment will be shown and queries resolved.

Sickness cover for the house manager – Kelly gave assurances that she would arrange sickness cover with either another house manager or herself.

She was also asked if McCarthy Stone would contribute to our Christmas meal out and she agreed to look into it.

North Yorkshire Bus Cuts

Margaret Clarke reports that the Filey Town Bus (F1 - F3) has appeared on a schedule of commercial services which are no longer viable without financial support. Local Authority funding is being used on a temporary basis until April 2023.

Margaret says "I think we need to get another petition going. It looks as though the Filey circular bus service is under threat. I know a lot of our residents use it. Of course it won't make money as it's used largely by pensioners". Another case of use it or lose it.

Re planning application - - - Change of use of agricultural land to a dog walking field

Online electronic objections now closed, 84 objections made 82 objecting, 2 supporting, you can still object but need to send emails to email is <u>PublicAccessPlanning@scarborough.gov.uk</u> with the reference 22/00909/FL. One step forward is that Public health Scarborough Council are now asking for the applicant to submit a plan for noise reduction before a decision is made so if the plan does get the go ahead there should be good noise prevention measures in place. We will keep you posted about any further developments.

October: Wildlife Around Filey

I begin with the news that there are now up to 50 Bottle Nosed Dolphins swimming up and down our stretch of the coast which is unusual since they only started appearing here three or four years ago according to someone I was talking to, who has been watching the coastal birds for 35 years.

Since my last report a number of other species have visited our area on their autumn migration.

A Barnacle goose was spotted at the Carr Naze pond by Marys (K and W) and continuing the goose theme a Brent Goose was reported at the same place and hundreds of Pink Footed Geese have been making their way South for the past two or three weeks.

Although I personally have not seen all of the following, these are some of the bird species being reported by local bird watchers: Brambling, Purple Sandpiper, Ring Ouzel, Wigeon, Lapwing, Pintail, Goosander, Eider, Red Flanked Blue-tail, Great Egret, Redstart, Redwing, Goldcrest, Firecrest, Whooper Swan, Whitethroat, Siskin, Willow Warbler, Redpoll, Little Gull, Curlew and Long Tailed Tit. Most of the above are passing through as migration continues through October.

Shortly after my last report I took Lulu for our morning walk. We left Chantry Gardens just after 8 o'clock and headed towards the Country Park, turning left up the path that runs alongside the Caravan Park. The path has trees and bushes on either side with a leafy canopy above. The beautiful song of the Robin, Wren and Blackbird accompany us as we progress to the open grass area beyond the caravans. Here there are a few Pied Wagtails and some Goldfinch fly overhead. Then approaching the top car park near the Brigg I spot a few birds moving among the scrub and bushes. I identify four Greenfinch and three Goldfinch. A few yards further along we come across a pair of Stonechats, Lulu sits quietly behind me as I spend a few minutes watching them feed on insects and admire their plumage.

Then we are at the cliff top looking out across the North Sea, the sun is out and the water is calm and clear and it is not long before I see a number of Gannets flying around in the middle distance. Through my monocular I can observe the different plumages of different ages, the very dark ones are this years' young, the mottled ones are two and three years old and the adults are mainly white with the last third of their wings black. Suddenly I see them wheel around and one after the other dive into the sea from a height of about 15 metres and then re-surface two or three seconds later. They must have found a shoal of mackerel.

A little later we are scrambling down the cliff path towards the Bay. It is not long before I hear the distinct call of the Oystercatcher. There are about seven of them and looking closer I see there are two other waders amongst them. One of them is the peculiar looking Curlew with its' very long decurved bill. The other is a Redshank with its' long bright orange/red legs.

I then take a look into the Bay and notice a lone Common Scoter (a type of duck) and a little closer but widely spaced are three Red Throated Divers. Suddenly the face of a grey seal appears, he is close enough for me to see the mottled grey coat around his neck before he disappeared.

We complete our circuit by strolling along the wide sandy beach to the Yacht Club and up the steep road that cuts through the ravine known as Arndale and then past the cafe at the top and then arrive back home at about 9.15.




