A 21 mile stretch of the Yorkshire Coast has officially become part of the King Charles III England Coast Path.

The King Charles III England Coast Path is a new walking route that will follow the entire coast of England.

The idea is that for the first time people will have the right of access around all the nations open coast. The path is being opened in sections but will, when completed, be the longest coastal path in the world and will be designated a National Trail.

The new section of the route from Bridlington north sands to Filey Brigg means there are now 794 miles of walkable coastal path around the UK coastline. The section was officially opened 10th May by Filey Town Mayor, Councillor Jacqui Houlden-Banks.

In the North East, the following sections are open to the public:

- Skegness to Mablethorpe (26 Km / 16 miles)
- Bridlington to Filey Brigg (34 Km / 21 miles)
- Filey Brigg to Newport Bridge (110 Km / 69 miles)
- Newport Bridge to North Gare (16 Km / 10 miles)
- North Gare to South Bents (55 Km / 34 miles)
- South Bents to Amble (71 Km / 44 miles)
- Amble to Bamburgh (47 Km / 29 miles)

SUPPORT NEEDED TO SAVE 'LITTLE BUS'

Attempts are being made to keep Filey's Little Bus on the road after the recent retirement of Colin Galway, who ran the

community transport scheme for 17 years.

The plan is for a local group to be set up to take on the running of the community bus service for the town. Coun Sam Cross is one of those involved in trying to keep the service going and he hopes local people will come forward to help.

A survey has been launched to get local people's views on the service. The results will identify key areas of service for the Little Bus and support for service moving forward. The survey, backed by the Town Council, stresses: "Without community support, the provision of a service within the town unfortunately will not be possible." A community consultation event is also being planned.

Filey SteamPunk Weekend 20 & 21st May & Regatta Weekend at the Sailing Club

Another busy weekend in Filey. Lovely weather.

The steampunk aesthetic is inspired by the fashions of Victorian Era in England (1837-1901), but also by the Belle Epoque in France (1871-1914) and the Civil War era in the United States (1861-1865). The clothing from these eras is often modernized by the addition of mechanical elements with gears showing.

Futuristic, yet retro at the same time, Steampunk is truly one-of-a-kind. The genre blends the aesthetic and technology of the 19th century with elements of science fiction. Its literary and audiovisual works take place in an alternate reality where technological progress is based not on electricity, but on the steam engine.

Steam is a central element of steampunk. The technology featured in this universe is generally just as advanced as that of our modern world, but it uses steam as its energy source instead of electricity, gas or oil. As a result, steampunk technology takes on a retro look reminiscent of the Industrial Revolution era.
